14 Day Books-Mini-Overviews

Fiction

Twice by Mitch Albom (**Large Print**). Here is a story about an 8-year-old boy who discovers that he has the “magical” ability to get a second chance at everything. He can undo an event in his life and then live it again. However, he must accept the consequences of his second attempts. We follow him through the years as he continually corrects his “mistakes.” Will this power put him at risk? An “enchanting” emotional story.

The Christmas Stranger by Richard Paul Evans (**Large Print**). A “powerful, thought-provoking” story about the holidays. A grief-stricken man who has given up on Christmas meets unexpected life changes. A tale of loss, love, and renewal.

The Seven Rings by Nora Roberts (**Large Print**). This is book 3 of the Lost Bride Trilogy. The conclusion of this trilogy finds two women preparing for a terrifying showdown. It has been described as a wonderful ending to a great series.

The Devil's Daughter by Danielle Steel. A “compelling” novel about two very different sisters: the one, Billie, bookish, kind; the other, Mickie, with a big ego and always seeking attention. Surprisingly, they move in together. Thus begins a story of a “strained” bond between them. An “unforgettable” tale of good and evil.

Mystery

Nash Falls by David Baldacci (**Large Print**). This is the first of two in a series featuring Walter Nash. Nash is recruited by the FBI to assist in infiltrating an international crime network. This network is suspected of laundering money through the company he works for! Can he succeed without jeopardizing all he believes in?

Agatha Christie's Last Death of the Year by Sophie Hannah (**Large Print**). This is a new Hercule Poirot mystery. Here the “brilliant” Belgian detective is on a Greek Island when he must investigate a “chilling” murder on New Year’s Eve, 1932 in the strange guest house where he is staying. He and inspector Catchpool vow that the first murder of the year will be the last.

The Viper by Brad Meltzer (**Large Print**). Another in the Zig and Nola series. The story involves a “shocking” cold case, a sinister plot, and a deadly secret. A mystery with many twists and turns. Described as “expertly crafted” and filled with tension.

Evil Bones by Kathy Reichs. (**Large Print**). Forensic anthropologist Temperance Brennan finds herself involved in “grisly” animal killings that evolve into something much worse. What is the motivation for these acts? Can she find answers in this “twisty, magnetic” thriller?

The Invisible Woman by James Patterson. We meet an FBI agent going undercover as a nanny. She must investigate the criminal connections of this family. The more she learns, the more she becomes invisible. Does danger for her lurk behind her deception? A “fast-paced ride.”
