
like Waterman Village a better choice.

According to LeadingAge, in 40 studies, all statistically significant comparisons favored not-for-profit service providers. This comparison, which looked at results dating from 1965 to 2003, suggest that, on average, *not-for-profit* service providers deliver higher quality care than for-profit service providers.

Jeff Bassett, Gerontologist in central Florida, also notes that in his 35+ year career he has observed that not-for-profit communities tend to have higher levels of staffing, lower staff turnover, higher quality dining experiences and more satisfied employees and residents.

How a Simple Fountain Pen Launched a Community





From a Hospital to a Village

In 1989, Waterman Village opened as an extension of the Waterman Hospital. In 1992, Waterman Village became it's own distinct 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization with a volunteer Board of Directors.

From Fountain Pens to the Fountain Inn

Frank Dan Waterman was born in

Altorf, Illinois, in 1869 and quit school at age 14 to work after his father died. His uncle, L.E. Waterman, took him to New York in 1893 to help with his new business of manufacturing fountain pens. When L.E. died, Frank greatly expanded production and launched an aggressive advertising campaign that made the Ideal Fountain Pen – as it was called then – a household name and a world-wide favorite at the turn of the 20th century.

When he was 32, Frank established a winter home on Blue Lake in Eustis and planted a grove. In 1922, at the urging of local residents, he agreed to spend \$500,000 constructing the block-long, 164-bedroom Fountain Inn hotel to host the hundreds of tourists he hoped to attract to the area. A year later, the Fountain Inn opened, with four stories, a basement and roof garden.

From an Inn to a Hospital

In the frantic boom of the early 1920s, the Fountain Inn did a capacity business. It was open only from Christmas to Easter as most Triple A tourist hotels were at the time. But the end of the Florida land boom in 1926, and the accompanying sluggish tourist business, made continuing the hotel operation unprofitable.

Three prominent Eustis physicians – Drs. C.M. Tyre, Rabun Williams and Louis Bowen – persuaded Waterman to give the Fountain Inn building to the Lake County Medical Society to operate as a hospital.

Frank Waterman died at 67 in New York on May 6, 1938, and the hotel was formally opened as a hospital with 50 beds six months later.

Since then, Waterman Village retirement community in Mount Dora, Florida, has grown to become one of the Southeast's most popular total retirement living community destinations that offers:

- ✓ independent living homes and apartments
- ✓ assisted living apartments
- ✓ skilled nursing and rehabilitation center
- ✓ a memory support center
- ✓ an outpatient physical-occupational-speech therapy clinic that's open to the public
- ✓ a full service home care agency that serves Lake County, and
- ✓ Chapel Fellowship church

Jeff Bassett has worked in the senior living industry for more than 40 years and is currently a department director at Waterman Village. We sat down with Jeff to get his perspective on navigating senior living options.

Q. Tell us a little about your background.

A. My first position in senior living was back in 1983, when I worked for Ohio Presbyterian Retirement Communities. Since then, I've held a variety of positions, from nursing assistant to executive director. I am a former adjunct professor of Health Care Administration at Kent State University. And for 37 years, I've been a Gerontologist, trained in the physical, psychological and social aspects of aging.

Q. What sort of things are important as one ages?

A. Certainly one's physical health and well-being are vital to aging well. That can include such things as exercising, eating well, getting enough rest, finding ways to relieve stress and having access to healthcare and wellness opportunities. There are psychological aspects to consider – memory, creativity, intelligence. And, the social elements would be relationships, work, volunteering, family and retirement choices.

Q. Tell us more about the value of social interaction.

A. Research, as well as my own career experience, has shown that loneliness and isolation have very real, negative impacts on one's health and wellbeing. By contrast, studies show that people who (for example) dine with others enjoy improved nutrition, better mobility, reduced anxiety and depression, stronger relationships, and an enhanced quality of life. At Waterman Village, residents enjoy countless opportunities to experience connection, companionship, love and support from their neighbors and staff members.

Q. How does the choice of where to live come into play?

A. Many folks believe that the best way to stay independent is to remain in their private house as long as possible. However, I've witnessed over the years that those who adopt this strategy often become MORE dependent on others – for housekeeping, laundry, meals, yard care, shopping, transportation and so on. The truth is that many of the things you need as you age are simply not available in your current house. So it's really important to choose a community and location that allow you to live your best life and stay independent and active as long as possible.

Q. Why do various levels of care matter?

A. Most communities built in central Florida only offer independent living and assisted living with perhaps some memory support. Waterman Village, as a full-service progressive living community, provides all that PLUS home health care, outpatient therapies (physical, occupational and speech), post-hospital rehabilitation, and shortterm and long-term nursing care. Why is this so important? If a Waterman Village resident goes to the hospital and their doctor recommends rehab upon discharge, they know that they can come BACK HOME to Waterman Village for their care! Familiar surroundings, near their spouse and friends, and staff who know them... all that is good medicine!

Q. What should people look for in a retirement community?

A. My first recommendation is, if possible, to choose a stable and established community, one that has been around at least 15 years and that has not repeatedly changed ownership. Secondly, it's been my observation that if the community is a not-for-profit organization with management onsite, both residents and employees are

happier and more satisfied. Of course, progressive levels of care are vital. You'll also want to find a community that offers a robust calendar of life enrichment and wellness opportunities to keep you active and engaged. Finally, location, location, LOCATION! For example, Waterman Village is located in Mount Dora, a quaint small town that's not too rural and not too urban. You'll want to be sure the surrounding area offers the businesses and services you use regularly, plus has many attractions and activities for you AND your family and guests who visit you. You can't go wrong in Mount Dora, once recognized by USA Today as one of the best small towns in which to retire!

Q. Let's talk about cost.

A. It's common for communities like Waterman Village, which offer all levels of living on one campus, to require some type of buy-in fee. However, at Waterman Village, we offer a very low buy-in fee option for The Oaks villa homes. And for independent living residences that have a higher buy-in fee, we provide high lifetime refund options. This is

very unique in Florida. Since fewer than 10% of independent living residents will ever require long-term nursing care, it is unwise to pay a non-refundable buy-in fee just to get a discounted rate on a community's nursing care. Plus, moving to a community that requires a buy-in fee that becomes non-refundable after a few years can leave residents who desire or need to move feeling trapped, sad and remorseful.

Q. Why make decisions sooner rather than later?

A. One thing I've learned is that when someone moves to Waterman Village—an all encompassing, progressive living type of retirement community—while they are STILL independent and active, it increases the likelihood that they will REMAIN that way as long as possible! Most people want to make their own decisions—and not be a burden to their adult children, other relatives or friends. I realize retirement living options can be overwhelming and confusing, which is why many people put it off. But it IS possible to get a plan in place for the future, and I truly enjoy helping people


with that process. Starting early means that you have time to research your options, visit communities, and make a decision that is not rushed because of a health issue.


